





Changing Gun Laws

Last year the Supreme Court held that the Second Amendment to the US Constitution protects an individual's right to carry a firearm in public. This landmark decision established a fundamental right to possess a firearm outside the home. A general prohibition against carrying a firearm outside the home is unconstitutional. Massachusetts, like some states, requires a license to carry a firearm outside the home, and a new case (*Commonwealth v. Guardado*) handed down by the Commonwealth's highest court now requires the prosecution to prove beyond a reasonable doubt that a defendant did not have a valid firearms license. This is a big deal because, in 2022, over 6,000 people were charged with carrying a firearm without a license. If a person is convicted of that charge, they have no choice but to spend 18 months in jail. In theory, the *Guardado* case makes it harder for the Commonwealth to win its case. Before this, a defendant was required to come forward with evidence that he or she had a license to possess a firearm. Once the defendant did so, the burden then shifted to the Commonwealth to persuade the jury beyond a reasonable doubt that the license didn't exist. That's not the way things are going to work going forward. Now, the absence of a license is an essential element of the offense of unlawful possession of a firearm, which requires the Commonwealth to prove that the defendant failed to comply with the licensure requirements for possessing a firearm. In plain English, it's probably not enough for a cop to say, "we looked him up in the system and he didn't have a license." I, and lots of other lawyers in Massachusetts, are currently litigating this type of gun case. It will be interesting to see how things pan out.


